Each summer, the SWHS English Language Arts department provides students with a reading assignment. The purpose of summer reading is to engage in ongoing reading and learning, and to develop a culture of literacy in our community.

For each book, you are required to keep a **reading journal**. You may do this either electronically or in a notebook. Your reading journal entries should "tell the story of your reading" by documenting the pages or section you read and reflecting on the section in 150 words or more. Your journal should be written in a personal style; it should have at least six entries for each book and will be scored based on thoroughness, thoughtfulness, and engagement.

<u>A Final Note</u>: Just as athletes need to stay in shape during the off-season, your summer reading assignment is meant to "keep you in shape" over the summer. Research supports that wide reading promotes academic success across all content areas. South Windsor High School is a community that values and celebrates literacy, so we encourage you to read **several** texts throughout the summer. This assignment serves as an opportunity to start the year on a positive note, and to engage in conversations with peers about several texts related to a common theme! If you don't do the reading assignment, you risk losing credit on the beginning of the year activities.
