

Summer Reading

Greetings SWHS Students and Families,

As we near the end of another academic year and head into the summer months, we hope that everyone enjoys some fun in the sun, while also keeping your minds active with summer reading. The purpose of summer reading is to engage in ongoing reading and learning, and to develop a culture of literacy in our community. This year, we expect that all of our students set personal goals for reading, and commit to reading at least one book that can be shared during opening activities in your English classroom in the fall.

Assignment for Students Entering Any English Course

Read any fiction or (novel-length) informational text and write a one-page personal response to the text. You may use the following prompts to help start your thinking:

 ★ Why does this text appeal to a particular audience? ★ How does the author develop relatable characters? ★ What themes are evident in the text? How does the author establish these themes? ★ How does this book compare with other titles in the same genre? ★ Do you have any unanswered questions about the story? What are they and why are you curious about them? ★ What moments or quotes from the text stood out? Why are they important? 	 ★ What was the author's purpose? Include evidence in your response to explain your thinking. ★ How is the argument or information organized? How does this affect your understanding of the text? ★ What are the main ideas presented in the book? How are these supported by details? ★ Describe new insights or understandings you have after reading the book. ★ Do you feel like the author is believable?Is the text written with any bias? Explain. ★ Describe how you can use what you learned from this book in your own life.
